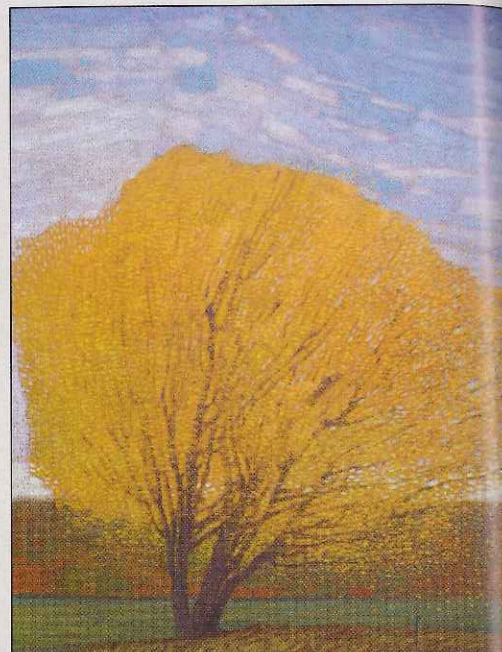
14TH QUEST FOR THE WEST SHOW & SALE - SEPTEMBER 6

The Eiteljorg Museum in Indianapolis, Indiana, will host the 14th annual Quest for the West Art Show and Sale, which will open September 6 and be on display until October 6. Opening weekend activities attract artists, buyers, and members of the media from throughout the country and, since its inaugural year in 2006, the show has generated more than \$13 million in art sales.

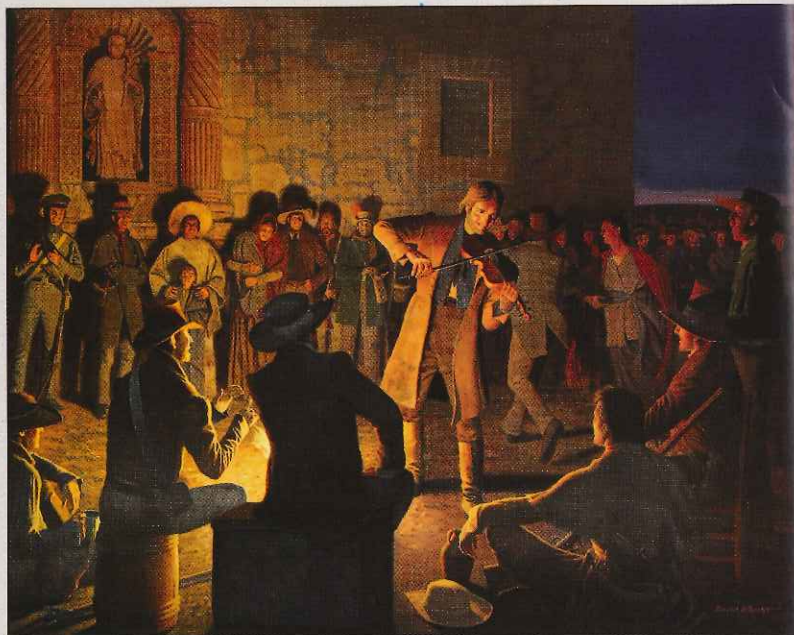
Pre-registered, opening weekend attendees will be the first to see and bid on paintings and sculptures by prominent Western artists in a luck-of-the-draw sale. This year's show will feature four artists, who will be making their first appearance at Quest, or returning for the first time in a few years. They are Tony Abeyta, Deborah Copenhaver Fellows, Dave Santillanes, and Mian Situ. Last year, Mark Kelso, who was participating in the show for the first time, won the Artists' Choice Award.

Friday, September 6 registrants will enjoy afternoon tours of two local collectors' home, an evening reception, and the opening of a special exhibition featuring 2018 Quest Artist of Distinction H. David Wright, a well as the return of a miniature art sale. The following evening, during the banquet and awards ceremony, several lucky attendees will win a limited edition 2019 Eiteljorg keepsake.
